



Supervision agreement (sample template) as part of a doctorate at the German Sport University Cologne

This agreement is oriented towards the recommendations of the DFG (German Research Foundation) and the WR (German Science Council). The agreement can and should be **continuously updated** with respect to further developments of research questions, individual qualification elements and mile stones of the doctorate by agreement between the supervisor and the PhD student.

2. Time schedule

2.1 The dissertation project should be finished in _____ years.

The supervisors commit themselves to provide subject-specific advice to the PhD students. They are responsible for the quality management of the dissertation. They structure the dissertation project in a way that it can be finished within the planned period and provide support for the adherence of the time schedule. This also includes (interdisciplinary) career support and networking in the scientific community. There will be detailed discussions at intervals of _____ months regarding the PhD progress, the results of which will be written down.
