Foundation of the German Sport University in continuation of the tradition of the German College for Physical Education in Berlin, which opened in 1920

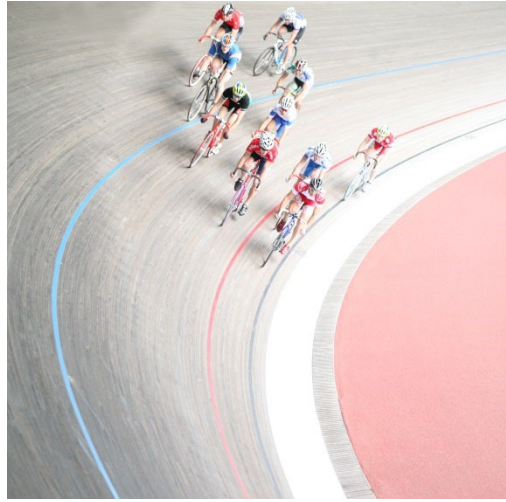

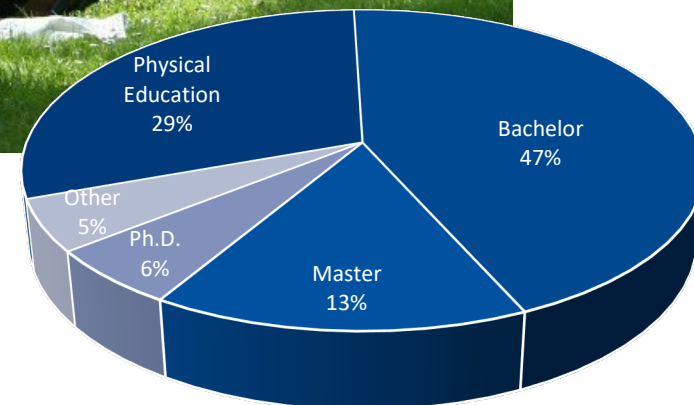

- Studying on the basis of excellent research
- 31 study programmes are offered by the GSU. These include teacher training education at Bachelor's and Master's level for all five school types as well as five Bachelor's degree programmes, nine Master's degree programmes, six Master's of Advanced Studies and the PhD Studies
- The diversity of the educational offers allows precise targeting in a later choice of profession and thus optimally prepares the students for the increasing differentiation of the occupational field of sport
- 65 partnerships with universities worldwide are available for a study visit abroad
- 6,000 students from 93 countries

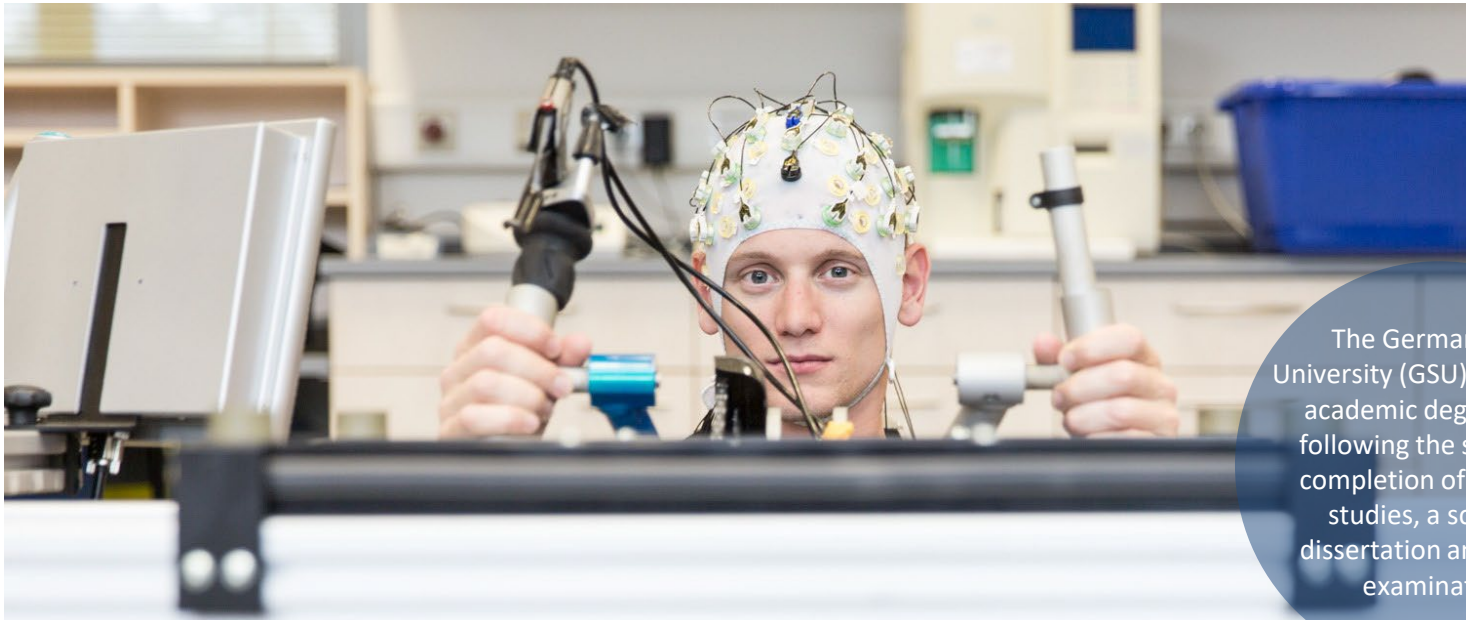
# Master's of Advanced Studies

## Physical Aptitude Test

- **19 of 20 individual performances** (Athletics, Gymnastics, Swimming, Team sports, Racket sports) must be completed
- **Endurance** – at the end of the day (2.000 m respectively 3.000 m)
- Date: twice a year
- Costs: 60 Euro
- Validity: three years
- Repetition: as often as you like

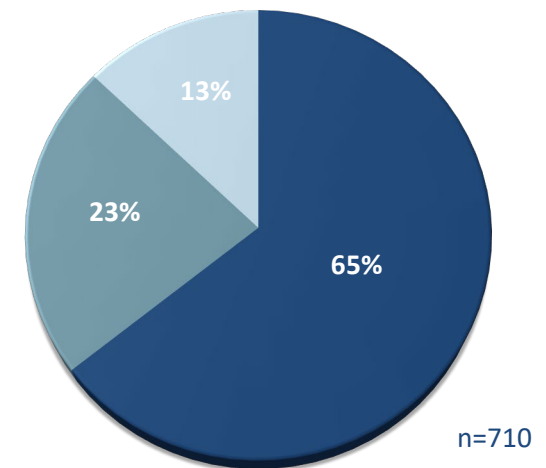
